San Mateo is a city of approximately 100,000 located 20 miles south of San Francisco. It is an extremely diverse community, crossing all socioeconomic and ethnic lines. San Mateo High School is one of seven schools in the San Mateo Union High School District. The San Mateo High School student body reflects the diversity of its enrollment district. Current enrollment in grades 9-12 is approximately 1407, with the class of 2013 at approximately 321. SMHS is one of six comprehensive high schools in San Mateo Union High School District (SMUHSD), and the most ethnically and socio-economically diverse of the SMUHSD schools. SMHS's ethnic distribution in 2012-2013 is as follows:

San Mateo High School is dedicated to combining academic excellence, community service and hands-on learning to provide a comprehensive and well-rounded college and career preparatory program for all its students. SMHS recommends students enroll in a 6-period day; however, students have the opportunity to take advantage of a 7-period day for support and enrichment courses.

**Grading/Transcripts**

The academic calendar is two semesters, 18 weeks each.

The **Academic GPA** covers Grades 9-12 and is cumulative of all courses taken. This GPA is **weighted** according to the California Public University system (an additional point is added for University-certified AP and Honors courses; e.g. A=5.0, B=4.0, C=3.0). Mid-year reports include the 7th semester. The **Total GPA** is **unweighted** for Grades 9-12 and covers the same coursework.

SMUHSD does not rank its students.
